Serving God and the community in Chichester

Dear friends,

Last Friday saw the coincidence of two events: the 80th anniversary of VJ Day and the Feast of the Assumption. For VJ Day, you may have heard the moving message by King Charles in which he said: 'On this day of profound remembrance,... we honour anew all those whose service and sacrifice saw the forces of liberty prevail... On this landmark anniversary, we should also pause to acknowledge that in the war's final act, an immense price was paid by the citizens of Hiroshima and Nagasaki - a price we pray no nation need ever pay again. But in recalling so much suffering, we must not lose sight of how great was the cause and how sweet the victory. For those heroes of VJ Day gave us more than freedom; they left us the example of how it can and must be protected. Countries and communities that had never before fought together learned to coordinate their efforts across vast distances, faiths and cultural divides. Together they proved that, in times of war and in times of peace, the greatest weapons of all are not the arms you bear, but the arms you link. That remains a vital lesson for our times. So to the families of all those who served, and to that sadly dwindling band of veterans among us still, please know that the courage and camaraderie displayed in humanity's darkest hour is a flame that shall blaze for eternity - a beacon that honours our past and guides our future. Let us therefore pledge to be *vigilant guardians of the values they bequeathed to us.'* The King's words resonate with the Assumption that declares Mary's bodily assumption into heaven. The dogma was proclaimed by the Catholic Church in 1950. As Graham Green stated at the time, the teaching acted as a powerful antidote to an age of wars that regarded human life, human bodies, as expendable. Instead, what the Assumption says about Mary it affirms as our common human destiny. Mary was a nobody in the world's eyes. Yet her assumption into heaven celebrates and honours the dignity and destiny not just of every person but our mortal bodily existence too. Who we are, body and soul, matters eternally to God whose love blazes eternally for us. In a new age of wars, when human life still counts for little, the Assumption should embolden us in the conviction that God is on the side of those who serve as vigilant guardians of the dignity of all life and work for peace.
