## THE TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD

# Dear friends,

The event of the Transfiguration can on first look seem mystically remote from our lives. What does Jesus' transformation on the top of a mountain, where his whole person and even his clothes become suffused with dazzling light, have to do with our everyday existence? What does it mean for our daily decisions that Jesus' closest disciples are terrified as they are overshadowed by a cloud on the mountain from which the voice of God the Father speaks, saying of Jesus, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!? To answer these questions, it is important to recall that the Transfiguration does not only say something about Jesus, but also about our destiny as human beings in relationship to God. Our humanity too is called to be enlightened with a light so bright it can seem like a terrifying darkness. This is not at all limited to a few special mystical experiences. As an example, consider a time when you have been in a crowd people and suddenly been struck by another person's existence. Perhaps they look at you and, rather than adverting your eyes in mild terror, you let your glances rest each in the other. Something is exchanged, demanded, understood - both illuminating and terrifying because it asks us to change our lives, to see each other in a new light. The Trappist monk Thomas Merton captured something of this in an account he gives of an experience he had in the shopping district in downtown Louisville, Kentucky: 'I was suddenly overwhelmed with the realization that I loved all those people, that they were mine and I theirs...if only everybody could realize this! But it cannot be explained. There is no way of telling people that they are all walking around shining like the sun.' Instead, as when Christ comes down the mountain to confront the world's suffering with the light of love, we are called to walk with him; letting our hearts and minds be guided by this light; celebrating the countless ways it is reflected in the faces of others; overcoming the fear, hatred and violence that would extinguish it; and so walk as children of light in service of the transfiguration of our world.

**Gift Aid:** Gift Aid envelopes are available in church that enable us to reclaim tax on donations made by UK taxpayers, increasing the donation by 25%.



Authorised Lay Ministry (ALM) Training Programme

The ALM training programme offers flexible, skillsbased training for lay people who feel called to serve in their local church. ALMs play a vital role in the public ministry of the Church, supporting and enriching parish life through a variety of ministries. While the shape of ALM ministry varies depending on the parish context, ALMs typically lead, support, or collaborate within ministry teams. They are also encouraged to nurture and develop the gifts of others in their communities. Training runs from September to May. There is training in the following ministry areas: • Catechists • Chaplaincy • Care for Creation & Eco Church • Mission Enabler • Pastoral Ministry • Preaching • Rural Ministry • Traditional Music in Worship • Worship & Liturgy • Youth & Children. To be accepted onto the course, candidates must: sponsors by their parish priest, be nominated by their PCC and be baptised, confirmed, and on the electoral roll of their sponsoring church.
