Serving God and the community in Chichester

Dear friends,

Last week the English version of Pope Leo's first apostolic exhortation was released (originally published on 4 October, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi). This is a teaching document that encourages a specific activity and is offered to 'all Christians'. Its title *Dilexi Te*, means 'I have loved you', and is taken from Revelation 3:9. These words are spoken by Jesus to a Christian community that had little influence or resources, and was treated with violence and contempt. This sets the tone for the document which highlights the central importance to the Gospel of the treatment of the poor. In this Leo takes up the work and call of his predecessor Pope Francis. The document's central message is stated thus: 'Love for the Lord, then, is one with love for the poor.... This is not a matter of mere human kindness but a revelation: contact with those who are lowly and powerless is a fundamental way of encountering the Lord of history. In the poor, he continues to speak to us.... I am convinced that the preferential choice for the poor is a source of extraordinary renewal both for the Church and for society, if we can only set ourselves free of our self-centeredness and open our ears to their cry.' This brings challenges. Sacred Scripture is clear about the poor, yet still many of us think we can 'safely disregard the poor.' Leo warns of 'a grave deficiency in our societies and also in our Christian communities.' He criticises wealthy elites 'who live in a bubble of very comfortable and luxurious conditions, almost in another world from the common people.' He asks, 'are the less gifted not human beings? Do not the weak have the same dignity as us? Are those born with fewer possibilities less valuable as human beings, and must they simply survive? The value of our societies depends on the answer we give to these questions, and our future also depends on it. Either we regain our moral and spiritual dignity, or we fall as if into a pit of filth.' We should respond by making Leo's final words our own: 'Christian love breaks down every barrier, brings close those who were distant, unites strangers, and reconciles enemies... A Church that sets no limits to love, that knows no enemies to fight but only men and women to love, is the Church that the world needs today.' With my prayers and blessings, **Fr Angus**
